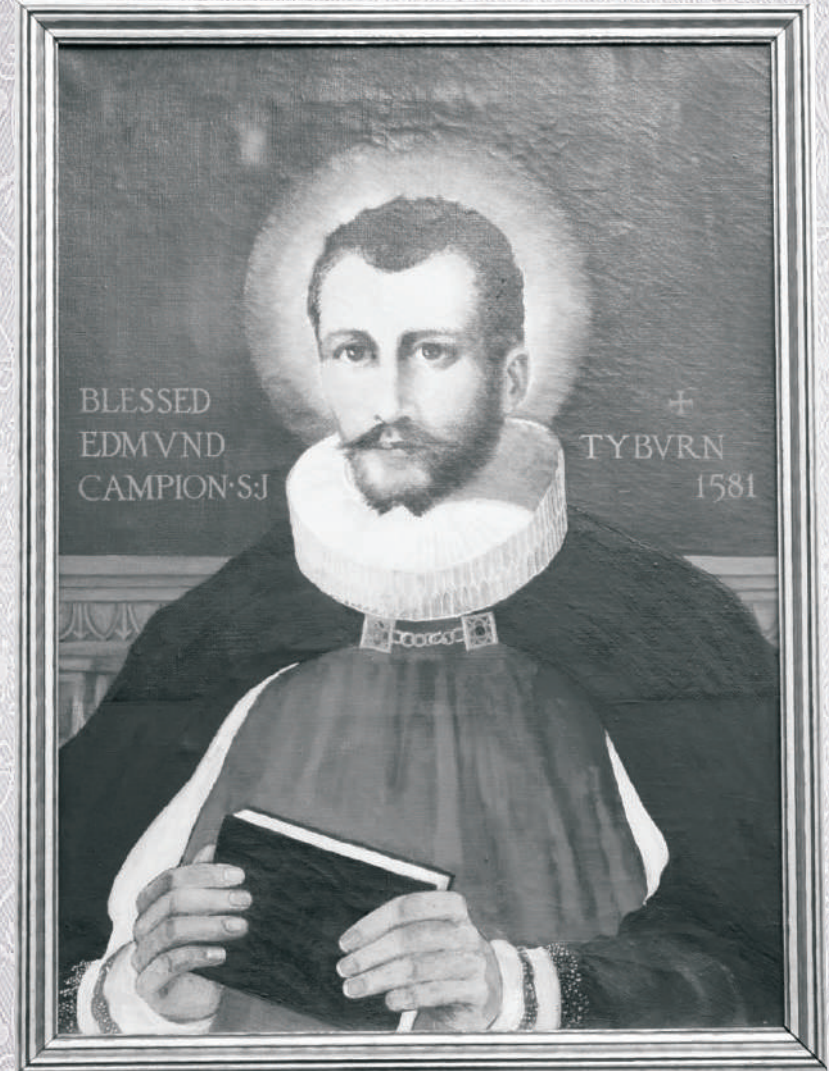

that they are wrong....

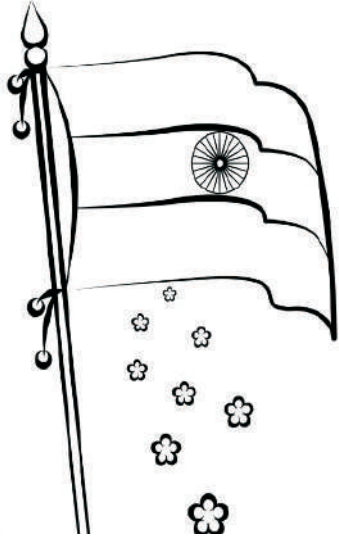
Violence at home can lead to blood in the streets

THE PREAMBLE OF OUR CONSTITUTION

We, the people of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all citizens:

- JUSTICE** - social, economic and political;
LIBERTY - of thought, expression, belief, faith & worship;
EQUALITY - of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all
FRATERNITY - assuring the dignity of individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation.

In our Constituent Assembly this twenty-sixth day of November 1949, do hereby adopt, enact and give to ourselves this Constitution.

Large areas of injustice exist in my country in the social and economic spheres. I promise not to accept injustice as inevitable, but to find ways and means within my reach and that of my school community of students, teachers and parents, to actively promote justice in my country.

Where wisdom is called for, force is of little use

Freedom of thought, expression and belief have been guaranteed to every citizen. I shall never be a party of the suppression of any legitimate expression of freedom by a fellow citizen of mine. Equality of status and opportunity are only tantalising dreams, testing illusions for many millions of my country men as my equal and shall feel happy when more and more of the underprivileged get opportunities to improve their status.

Unity and integration are yet very distant goals. I promise to contribute actively to the union of the people of India by my greater knowledge, understanding, appreciation and love of the various people of India, even though very different from me.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND
STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND AIMS**

Campion School, Bhopal, was established in July 1965 and Campion School, Bhouri, was started in July 2006 which is run by the members of the Society of Jesus commonly called the Jesuits.

The Society of Jesus, a Roman Catholic Religious Order founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540, has been active in the field of education throughout the world since its foundation. The Society of Jesus in India is providing quality educational service to the nation reaching out to all age groups of the people. It is managing number of primary schools, secondary and higher secondary schools, colleges, universities and institutes of higher learning, technical schools, institutes of business and rural management, institutes of media and communications, etc. where millions of young people of both sexes belonging to every class, community and religious group are being educated. "The visible face of the Church and the Society in India is education." These institutions are part of the Catholic Church's effort to share in the country's educational undertaking. This effort, while particularly responsible to the Christian community, has always been at the service of the whole nation. In these institutions, recognised as Christian minority Institutions, the religious beliefs of all students are treated with respect; students learn to value inter-religious collaboration and acquire basic understanding and respect for the faith vision of the members of the diverse religious communities, while deepening their own response to God.

Jesuit education is inspired by the vision of man drawn from the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, who symbolises love and forgiveness of God, who lives in solidarity with all who suffer and pours out his life in the service of others for the total and integral liberation of human person leading to participation in the life of God himself. Jesuit education is also based on the principles of character formation elaborated by

St. Ignatius of Loyola. 'While it respects the integrity of academic disciplines, the concern of Jesuit education is preparation for life,.... Jesuit education is also concerned with the ways in which students will make use of their formation within the human community, in the service of others.' **'The goal of Jesuit education in today's understanding of Ignatius world-view is not to prepare a socio-economic elite rather to educate leaders in service.'**

(The Characteristic of Jesuit Education # 37,110)

Jesuit education system is a failure if the student moves out from its institution "without having grown in his sense of the divine reverence of the sacred, respect for human life, compassion for the poor, concern for justice, awareness of oppressive social structures and commitment to help build a more just and more human community. " (Fr. Nicolas Adolfa, Superior General of the Society of Jesus)

This vision and the principles of character formation give Jesuit institutions a specific character and set before their staff and students the sense of the divine, the ideals of humanism and service towards which they are invited continually to strive.

Campion School, therefore, aims at the integral formation of each student.

- The fullest possible development of all of the God-given talents which are to be put to use for the good of the human community;
- sound intellectual formation with growing ability to reason reflectively, logically and critically;
- development of the imaginative, the affective, and the creative dimension of each student who can appreciate literature, aesthetics, music and the fine arts;
- development of communication skill;
- physical development through sports and physical education;
- formation in values and development of attitudes of respect love and service transcending race, culture and religion;
- development of reverence for the divine, and for creation;

- development of sense of social justice and dignity of labour.
- To accomplish this, it endeavours to create a school climate which generates a love for learning, habit of critical thought and accurate expression, and strength of character and moral values needs for a life that is socially meaningful. To this end special efforts are made:
- To help students acquire sound judgement, spiritual orientation, and an integrated character;
- To encourage them continually to strive for excellence in every field;
- To be clear and firm on principles, courageous and resolute in action;
- To value and judiciously use their freedom;
- To overcome selfishness and lack of concern for others and commit themselves in the service of their fellow-men and become agents of progressive social change;
- To instil in them a true national spirit, a deep love for the motherland, an appreciation of Indian culture, values, language, and things Indian, and a keen civic and social sense.

Excellence in education is measured not by the quantity of work produced by the ablest students but by the degree by which every student has realised his/her full potential. In other words, it is not the highest point the best students reach but the distance through which all students move from the point of their start to the farthest reaches of their development. The criterion of excellence is the fullest possible development of each person's individual capacities at each state of life, joined to the willingness to continue this developed gifts for others'. Self-discipline is expected of each student, manifested

in intellectual rigour and persevering application to serious study.

In the development of intelligence, accent is placed on the cultivation of creative and critical intellects so that the students are able to see, perceive, understand, discern and evaluate true life situations.

However, education is not merely the development of intelligence but also to make students sensitive to injustice in modern society and encourage solidarity with the disadvantages and dispossessed of modern global society by putting to use God given talents for the good of the human community.

In the formation of character, emphasis is laid on total human development of students by bringing them into contact with themselves by realistic knowledge, love and acceptance of self.

At the same time they are led to realise themselves as members of the larger human community. Thus they are encouraged to overcome selfishness and lack of concern for others and inculcate qualities of commitment, initiative, team spirit, integrity, respect, honesty, austerity simplicity and service to others.

Campion School thus aims at making its own contribution towards a transformation of the prevailing social conditions so that the principles of distributive and social justice, equality of opportunity, genuine freedom, and respect for social, religious and moral values enshrined in the Constitution of India may ; prevail and that all men live in keeping with their human dignity and self-respect. YOUR EDUCATIONAL CHARTER

Good education is a process that brings about desirable growth in the student - growth that one is able to see from year to year and evaluate. There are various kinds of growth that must take place: Growth in the amount of knowledge and information about various subjects, persons and events.

Growth in the quantity of the information, namely greater understanding as well as increased ability to apply knowledge to a wide variety of situations, by developing one's ability to think (thinking means seeing new relationships between facts).

Growth in the number and kinds of skills and abilities one discovers and develops, e.g. to speak and write English/Hindi better; to work with one's hands to fashion objects; to learn games such as cricket, football, basketball, etc.; to learn to cycle or swim; to play musical instruments, etc. Growth can be either in learning a new skill or improving on the skill already learned.

Growth in interests, in the formation of habits, values and attitudes - developing and pursuing personal interests and hobbies some of which will become lifelong assets.

Developing habits such as punctuality, regularity, order, working according to a timetable, self-reliance, especially developing independent study techniques or learning to learn by yourself, etc.

Developing values and attitudes such as active concern for the things of the spirit and for moral and spiritual values; pride in one's country and eagerness to contribute one's talent to national development; concern for other and their needs and rights; civic consciousness;

need to strive after excellence and to shun mediocrity; eagerness to use personal effort and resourcefulness as much as possible rather than look too easily to others for help.

As you go through your school year, you should ask yourself whether you are able to see growth in one or more of these areas. To the extent that there is such growth your education is successful. But in the measure in which such growth is absent, your education is a failure.

Who is answerable ?

Obviously, all the three most concerned with your education must share responsibility; your home, your school and you yourself. Those at home and at school help in your education, into an unwilling head, but by providing and fostering a climate or atmosphere where learning can take place: where, by setting goals and challenges, by asking questions and leading you to self-discovery, they help you towards the goal of a self-reliant adult. They help you in all the ways mentioned above : to learn facts (the least useful commodity), to learn to understand and to think, to acquire new skills and habits, and to assess and adopt values and attitudes.

To the extent that you cooperate with your home and your school, you, the important third partner, whose education is the concern of the other two, will contribute most to your personal growth. In turn, you will be able to contribute significantly to the growth of the society.

COURSES OF STUDY

Campion School Bhourri, is newly affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Delhi. RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

The greater the cooperation between home and the school, the more fruitful is the educational effort and the faster and surer the child's progress.

1. As a first step in this direction we earnestly recommend that the parents / guardians familiarise themselves with this diary and the rules it contains.
2. Parents / guardians cannot dictate to the Management, but the Management has the right to say on what conditions they will admit or retain pupils in the institution.
3. The school expects the cooperation of the parents to ensure that:
 - students come to school regularly and punctually, are dressed neatly and correctly;
 - students bring to school correct books and notebooks which should be properly maintained;
 - students prepare their lessons and do their homework regularly.
 - students do not study late into the night as it may affect their physical and mental health due to loss of sleep.
4. Parents must check the diary of their wards regularly and enforce regularity and discipline at home and see that their wards prepare their lessons and do the assigned homework. Remarks made in the diary should be seen and countersigned. If this advice is followed, parents will notice improvement in their children.
5. Parents are expected to cooperate with school authorities in their insistence upon punctuality, discipline, personal cleanliness, wearing of correct school uniform and the preparation of daily lessons.

6. Parents are particularly obliged to sign the warning notes entered on the Principal's Remarks page of the diary, or official circulars, test and examination results or similar documents. Failure to comply with this rule will result in the pupil being sent home in which case the school disclaims all responsibility.
7. Parents are requested to give specimen signatures, preferable of father and mother, who will be responsible for signing the remarks or leave record page in the school diary. An occasional check should be made to see if the signatures genuine.
8. Parents / guardians or others may not visit the children or interview their teachers during the school hours without sanction of the Principal. The staff should be seen preferably during their off periods; an appointment with a member of the staff should be arranged before hand. In urgent cases students may be contacted through school office.
9. Criticism of teacher or the school in the presence of the student should be studiously avoided as it is likely to harm both. Should you have a legitimate complaint, meet the Principal. If there is serious and persistent complaint against the school, the parent is advised to withdraw his ward from the school.
10. Any pupil who is seriously ill or suffering from an infectious disease, should not be send to school. If he/she is likely to be absent from school for three days or more, the Principal should be informed. On recovery, he must submit medical certificate stating that he is fully cured.
11. Parents are requested not to plan outing / pilgrimages holidays during school days and take leave of the minimum number of days for marriage or family functions or visits. To be sanctioned by the Principal.
12. Leave taken by your ward for mere social functions is not recommended. Taking leave frequently retards academic progress and disturbs the habit of regular work.

13. Parents are particularly expected to sign the progress report, diary, or any other document when requested.
14. Should you feel that your ward does not make the desired progress, the Principal should be contacted well in time. If there is real need of a private tutor, arrange for one only after getting permission from the Principal. No teacher is allowed to tutor the student of a class, he/she teaches.
15. Parents are informed that their children are liable to be suspended or given warning letter for-
 - * repeatedly not wearing the correct uniform.
 - * repeatedly not getting the remarks signed and/or not having the leave record duly completed.
 - * repeatedly forgetting to bring the required books and the school diary daily to school.
 - * repeatedly coming to school late.
16. Parents are requested to notify in writing any change in their address or telephone number to the Principal.
17. Parents are also expected to cooperate with the school authorities by taking an active and helpful interest in the activities of the school. In particular they are understood to have entrusted the Principal with authority to correct and take action against their children at his/her reasonable discretion.
18. Your cooperation is requested to ensure that no sharp pointed articles, crackers or other dangerous articles are brought to school. Any student found possessing these articles, whether used or not, will be subjected to strict action or be summarily dismissed from the school.
19. Parents are expected to attend Parents-to-School meetings. Failure to attend such meetings will indicate that they are not sufficiently interested in the progress of their wards and hence they may be asked to withdraw their wards from the school. The dates for Parents-to-School meeting are notified by circulars.

Learn to walk before you run

20. In communicating with the Principal or Vice Principal, parents are requested to mention the name, class and section of their wards.

21. Parents are advised not to set goal and expectation beyond the reach of their wards. Pressing it too far may result in acute frustration or nervous breakdown or simply a non performance.

22. Parents are advised not to over-pamper or over-protect their wards by fulfilling all their demands or wishes. Certain exposure to reality of nature and society may better prepare them to face life.

23. Your wards will not be sent home before the end of school hour except for disciplinary reasons. If they are required to go home early for some urgent reason, parents must come to take them.

ROLE OF PARENTS IN EDUCATION

"Since parents have conferred life on their children, they have a most solemn obligation to educate, their offspring. Hence parents must be acknowledged as the first and foremost educators of their children. Their role as educators is so decisive that scarcely anything can compensate for their failure in it. For it devolves on parents to create a family atmosphere so animated with love and reverence for God and men that a well rounded personal and social development will be fostered among the children."

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

Campionites are expected to conduct themselves as disciplined students at all times and in all places. Politeness proper manners and etiquette is the hallmark of a good citizen Wholehearted cooperation of parents is expected in the character formation of their children. As the pupil progresses from lower to upper classes, he/she will be given increasing opportunity to shift from conforming to externally imposed order to self-imposed discipline.

The school will insist on punctuality, regular attendance cleanliness in dress, general grooming, and fidelity to study and work assignments.

1. Students should reach school at least five minutes before the first bell is rung for morning assembly. At the stroke of first bell all must immediately line up classwise for morning assembly.
2. After morning assembly the students should go to their classrooms in, single line and in silence.
3. Good behaviour and application of mind is expected from all in the classroom.
4. If a teacher does not arrive in the classroom within two minutes after the bell, the second monitor should report the fact to the office while the first monitor assumes responsibility for order and discipline in the class until a substitute teacher arrives.
5. When leaving classroom for P.T., games and practicals, students must move along the corridors and the stairs in single file and in perfect silence.
6. No student is allowed to remain in the classroom during recess or P.T. period. Once on the playground, nobody should return to the classroom without special permission of the Principal or PTI and, if so, he/she must be accompanied by the monitor.
7. Pupils must attend physical education, games and other activities outside school hours when required to do so.

Participation on such occasions will be deemed compulsory by the school authorities since games and athletics play an important part in the student's all-round education.

8. As Campion is an English Medium school, students should speak English in the school premises in order to acquire fluency in the language.
9. Besides text books no other books (novels, magazines, newspapers or comics) are to be brought to school. The penalty will be confiscation or any other punishment.
10. The school diary should be brought to school daily. It should be used to note down daily lessons, home work, and other instructions given by the teachers. Any student tampering with his or another child's school diary will be seriously punished.
11. The school will not be held responsible for the loss of money, books, fountain pens, watches or other articles. Students should not bring big sum of money, valuable watches, mobile phones, etc. to school. They do so at their own risk.
12. Lost articles like tiffins or compass boxes, rain coats, blazers, watches etc. must be claimed from the Principal within a month after which period the unclaimed articles will be disposed. If each pupil has his name marked on the article it helps to find the owner of the lost articles.
13. No collections should be made for any purpose whatsoever without the previous sanction of the Principal and, if sanctioned, the accounts must be submitted for its scrutiny
14. Every student should endeavour to keep up the good name of the school by excelling in good behaviour and polite manners both inside and outside the school. They should remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
15. Students are forbidden to bring mobile phones, transistors, video games, talking watches, crackers, explosives and other dangerous material to school. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against such offenders, which may even mean suspension or dismissal, irrespective of them used or not.

It's never too late to mend

16. Personal cleanliness is expected from all pupils. The uniform must be clean and neatly pressed, shoes polished, finger nails pared, hair trimmed and neatly combed. A pupil may be sent home for lack of personal cleanliness, long hair, dirty clothes and shoes after a warning in the school diary.
17. All students should take an honest pride in keeping the school premises clean, taking care during recess not to litter the compound and roads with lunch scraps, fruit peels, etc. They should make use of the dustbins provided for the purpose.
18. Students who expect to return home late are responsible for informing their parents about in advance especially when they have to play a match.
19. In all cases of doubt regarding the correct interpretation of the school rules, the decision of the Management is final and no appeal lies anywhere except with the Governing Body.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

1. All are expected to attend class on the reopening day after each vacation, much more so on the first day of the new academic year. Those absent without prior sanctioned leave will be fined at the discretion of the Principal. Those absent because of sickness must inform the school before or on the reopening day and present a medical certificate before they are admitted to class failing which they must pay the imposed penalty. **Absence without prior sanctioned leave for more than five days immediately after a vacation renders the student liable for dismissal.**
2. Attendance on Annual Sports days and National Feast days is compulsory. Absence on such occasions will incur serious disciplinary action and/or heavy fine. *Leave application for genuine reason should reach the Principal on / before the day of compulsory attendance.* Similarly, absence from school prior

Half a loaf is better than none

to tests or examinations will incur disciplinary action.

3. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience, or conduct harmful to the moral tone of the school, a week's inexcusable absence, and intentional discourtesy and disrespect to teachers are each a sufficient cause for disciplinary action.
4. For habitual breach of discipline or any serious bad behaviour, serious remarks are given either in the school diary or on school letter pad and the same record is maintained in the school office. These remarks are warnings, thereafter the recipient is liable for disciplinary action from the school. Remarks are issued by the Principal on their own or on recommendation from the teachers. Such remarks are cumulative. These remarks have to be signed by the parents/guardians in the presence of the Principal or within three days after they are issued.
5. A pupil who uses unfair means and/or receives or assists others in any form during tests or examinations or tampers with the evaluated answer papers in any way or alters marks in the report card or the answer papers will be given zero in the subject and a warning remark will be given to him. A pupil using unfair means in any subject of the examination will be debarred forth with from giving further exams in that subject and zero marks to be awarded. Repetition of the same may result in dismissal.
6. If a pupil defaces or loses his diary, he will be subjected to disciplinary action. A fine of Rs. 150/- will be levied and a new diary will have to be purchased with the remark that the previous one was defaced or lost.
7. Those who come to school without proper uniform or the school diary will, after one warning, be fined and/or sent home and marked absent.
8. No pupil may leave the school premises during school hours without written permission of the Principal. Students who violate

this rule will be given a serious warning, and if repeated, will be either suspended or given a final written warning.

9. Student, present in the school, who absents himself/herself from any period or class without proper permission, will be given a written warning.
10. Any damage or disfigurement to school property must be made good. Besides, it carries a heavy penalty and may even result in dismissal.
11. Pupils are responsible to school authorities not only for their conduct in the school but also for their general behaviour outside the school. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct outside the school on the part of the pupils renders them liable to disciplinary action by the Principal which may even mean dismissal.
12. All students are expected to show due respect and obedience to those who are in authority, staff members, school captains, prefects, monitors, etc. Hence any act of insolence or disrespect, answering back, etc. will be taken seriously. Those responsible for misbehaviour will be suspended or even summarily dismissed.
13. Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or is repeatedly or wilfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in examinations or has committed an act of serious indiscipline and/or mis-behaviour, or who, in the opinion of the Principal has an unwholesome influence on his fellow pupils may be removed for a specified period from the rolls or expelled permanently by the Principal in accordance with the requirement of the Code.
14. In any act of collective indiscipline, if the main person responsible for it does not come forward, the whole class will be suspended for a very long period and they will be excluded from all important school functions and activities. School will not be held responsible for the loss of studies during this suspension period.

RULES FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

Campionites are expected to conduct themselves as disciplined students. Politeness, proper manners and etiquette is the hallmark of a good citizen.

1. All students should reach school atleast five minutes before the reporting time.
2. Students should come in proper and complete uniform.
3. House wise P T uniform with white shoes, white socks on every Thursday is must.
4. Personal cleanliness is expected from all students. Uniform must be clean and neatly pressed, shoes polished, fingernails pared, hair trimmed and neatly combed.
5. Girls having long hair should come in two plaits with black ribbons and girls with short hair with black hairband or black clips. No girls will be allowed extra-long sleeves in school.
6. Attendance compulsory on all school events and National feast days.
7. According to the CBSE norms minimum 75% attendance is a must. Promotion of the student will be on the basis of attendance, discipline and academic performance.
8. As Campion is an English medium school students should speak English in the school premises to acquire fluency in the language.
9. Students are forbidden to bring crackers, explosives and other dangerous materials to school. Strict disciplinary

action will be taken against such offenses, which may even mean suspension as dismissal.

10. Any damage to school property may carry heavy penalties and may even result in dismissal.
11. No accessories, mobiles, smart watches, ornaments, etc. will be allowed.
12. Students from class IX to XII will not be allowed to bring any type of vehicle to school.
13. Late comers, those with a reminder for wearing proper uniform or proper haircut would be sent back with parents after the warning for the same reason.
14. Once the student's diary and Id card is issued it is compulsory to bring it everyday without any failure.

NOTE: In all cases of doubt regarding correct interpretation of the school rules, the decision of the management will be final and no appeal lies anywhere except with the governing body.

EXAMINATIONS

1. The whole academic session is divided into two terms. April to October is the first term, and Nov- March the Second term. In the first term there is one periodic assessment of 20% and Half yearly examination of 80%. In the second term also there is one periodic assessment of 20% and final examination of 80% in march.
2. No student may absent himself/herself from an examination or Test, except when prevented by reasons of severe and unavoidable ill-health, in which case an application should reach the Principal on or before the day of examination or test and a medical certificate must be produced. The Principal may use his discretionary powers for examination and promotion of such students.
3. Those absent from an examination, partially or totally, without grave reasons/previous written permission will be regarded as having failed. They will be debarred from giving the same examination at a later date.
4. Unexplained absence from one or more subjects of an examination involves the loss of marks for those subjects and excludes the pupil from being ranked, graded in the order of merit and from a prize.
5. Any possession or use of unfair means detected during or subsequent to an examination is liable to punishment at the Principal's discretion and in serious and repeated cases the student will have to repeat the class or will be rusticated from the school.
6. For sufficient reasons, such as unsatisfactory progress in studies, insufficient attendance, serious misconduct, etc., a pupil may be debarred from an examination.
7. A student with a minimum of 80% of attendance will be allowed to appear in the two Terminal Examinations i.e. April to October and November to February, 28.

PROMOTIONS

1. A pupil must complete the two Periodic Tests, appear in the Half Yearly and Annual Examinations and obtain the qualifying grade to be promoted to the next class.
2. For promoting a pupil to next higher class, the current year's record of work will be taken into account, along with the marks of the examinations. Regular attendance, the study work will be a condition for promotion.
3. The year's record of work consists of the following:
 - The day-to-day written work including compositions home-work and daily lessons and periodical assessment.
 - The individual traits of character, such as good conduct, obedience, regularity, punctuality, a sense of responsibility, cooperation, sociability, etc.
 - Application and participation in the class, ability to formulate one's own answers, ability to converse in English, upkeep of note books, text books and school diary, discipline, punctuality, regularity, cleanliness and general behaviour.

4. If a pupil is unable to appear for the whole or part of the annual examination due to grave and unavoidable reason of ill-health, an application along with medical certificate from a doctor of the rank not lower than assistant surgeon should be forwarded to the Principal, who after ascertaining the genuineness of the case, may propose suitable alternatives for exams/promotion of the pupil concerned. He/she, however, will not be ranked in the order of merit.
5. All cases of doubts regarding promotion are left entirely to the discretion of the Principal and his decision is final.
6. Promotion once refused is not reconsidered.
7. A student failing to be promoted shall thereby forfeit for the ensuing year any concession in the fees, and may be advised to leave the school, particularly if his conduct has not been satisfactory.

ABSENCE AND LATE COMING

1. Leave of absence will be granted by the Principal for genuine reasons and only with a prior written application signed by the parents. This should later be entered briefly on the Leave/Absence Record page of the school diary and signed by the parent.
2. Leave of minimum number of days should be taken for family functions. A written application by the parents must be submitted to the Principal a week before.
3. A pupil who has been absent from the school without prior sanctioned leave must on return to the school bring reasons for his/her absence, entered and signed by his/her parents on the Leave/Absence page of the school diary. Failure to do so will result in the student being sent home for which the school disclaims all responsibility.
4. A pupil who has been recently suffering from or exposed to an infectious disease may not be allowed to attend school unless he has been in quarantine for the necessary period of time and

- brings a medical certificate stating that the period of infection/contagion is over. Appointments with doctors should be made after school hours.
5. In case of illness for more than 2 days, the Principal must be informed by letter regarding the nature of illness and the number of days the pupil is likely to be absent from school. On his return he will be required to produce his medical Certificate.
 6. Repeated absence without prior sanctioned leave or unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission, if granted, will be done on payment of re-admission fee. If not re-admitted, he/she will have to pay the fees retrospectively, if a transfer certificate is asked for.
 7. Pupils who are frequently late to school with no sign of improvement are liable to be suspended from the school.

PRIVATE TUITION

A Private tutor may be engaged only after the approval of the Principal has been obtained. The Principal or the Management of the school is not responsible for any misunderstanding that may arise between the parent/guardian and the member of the staff giving tuition. The contract is to be considered as taking place solely and entirely between the parent and member of the staff. No teacher is allowed to tutor students he/she teaches.

ADMISSION

1. The Principal reserves the right and discretion to admit or deny admission to candidates without assigning any reason for it and his decision is final.
2. All applications for admission to KG 1 must be made on the prescribed form. There are no regular registrations for other classes and admission to these classes is granted only to fill vacancies.

3. Admission to KG1 is made in November. For admission to other classes, if vacancy occurs, the application forms are issued sometime in the second week of June and an Entrance Test is held a week later. The candidate is tested in the matter of the class previous to the one for which he is seeking admission.
4. Admission forms must be duly filled in by parents within the stipulated time after the posting of the list of new admissions on the school notice-board. Failure to do so without a valid reason-in writing-to the Principal, will result in the cancellation of pupil's name from the list.
5. All documents requested for admission become the property of the school and are not returned on any account. Hence typed or xeroxed copies duly attested by the competent authority may be submitted.
6. Parents and guardians are warned that admission will be strictly on the merit of the candidate. Any effort to influence the authorities through recommendations, falsification of the date of birth, offering a donation, or pressure from any quarter will automatically disqualify the applicant from getting admission.
7. A student who joins fresh from home or from an unrecognised school has to produce an official birth certificate (municipal or baptismal certificate) in support of the date of birth entered in the admission form. This date of birth is considered as legally correct and no change or alteration is allowed later on.
8. A student from a recognised school cannot be admitted unless his Transfer Certificate from the previous school is countersigned by the Education Officer and produced.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The years a student spends in the school should enable her/him to acquire sound principles of conduct, and lay a solid foundation for true and purposeful living when he attains manhood. Values of honesty, trust, co-operation, service, self-reliance and hard work are inculcated through various school activities. In these activities the student learns to do things for him/herself under the steady supervision and guidance of moderators/teachers.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

THE HOUSE SYSTEM:

The main objectives of the House System are to foster in students a sense of collective responsibility, cooperation, group of collective life and solidarity, healthy competitive spirit, democratic leadership, etc. and at the same time to enkindle and develop the qualities latent in each of them.

It is the House System that channelizes discipline in school life with all its and co-curricular activities and directs the energies and talents of students.

There are four Houses in the school:

The **Gandhi House** (Red) - Motto. **'Unity is strength'**

The **Tagore House** (Green) - Motto: **'Now or never'**

The **Ashoka House** (Blue) - Motto: **'Never give in'**

The **Nehru House** (Yellow) - Motto: **'Service before self'**

Each student is assigned a House when he/she joins the school.

CRITERIA FOR SCHOOL OFFICIALS

- 1. Bona Fide Students:** For the post of school captain and the prefects the candidates must be a bona fide student of the school for at least three continuous years while for the post of Assistant School Captain and a Assistant Prefects candidates must be a bona fide students for at least two continuous years.
- 2. Academic requirements:** They must be rank holders securing minimum of 60% marks in the previous class with minimum of 75% attendance.
- 3. Character requirements:** His/her conduct must be above reproach and he/she must have a sense of honesty, duty, service, and fair play. He/she must be an example to all in his/her good behaviour, devotion to studies and faithful to the rules of discipline. Above all he/she must have good leadership qualities.
- 4. Responsibility:** Once elected as school officials, they must be regular to school, keep up their academic performance, discharge their duties faithfully and observe all rules of discipline. Any official who fails to live up to these expectations may be relieved of their post by the principal and be replaced by the student who secured next highest votes.

OTHER SCHOOL ORGANIZATIONS

Cub Packs: The aims and objectives of the movement are reverence to God and selfless service to the country and humanity in general. They are attained by developing the character of cubs, trying to mould them into good and useful citizens. Selection of recruits for Cub Packs is made from the Junior School (Primary).

Elocution, Debate And Dramatics: The aim is to train the students from the earliest years in the art of public speaking, and to discover talents for dramatics. To stimulate interest in this important branch of education, prizes are awarded annually to the best individual speakers both in English and Hindi, and to the best

class and House in Interclass, Inter-house Elocution, Dramatics and General Knowledge Competitions.

The Campionite: It is issued once a year in the form of an annual magazine to foster the literary talents of the students. The journal is managed by the editorial board consisting of the students and the staff.

Class VI -XII Girls:-

Striped greyish kurta with grey jacket having the school mono on it, and grey salwar, white inner compulsory. Black ribbon/hair band/ clips. Navy blue socks with white strip, black Gola Shoes.

Class VI -XII Boys

Same as primary uniform with full grey pant with black belt.

FEE RULES

Course fees for the full academic year is to be paid according to the details given in the fee book.

Fees when paid in cash, should be sent through a responsible person, Small children should not be entrusted with the payment of fees.

- The final progress report will not be issued until all fees for the full academic year have been paid.

BUS RULES

1. Please take note of the following before you utilise the services of the school bus:
 - (a) School transportation is optional. Reasonable good service is rendered to its users. However, it will not be at the beck and call of students or parents; undue demands and/or harsh criticism from parents are not expected and it would show that they are dissatisfied with the service. Hence, they will be asked to discontinue the use of school bus.
 - (b) Those Students who are willing to use bus service for **ONE ACADEMIC SESSION** bus fare is to be paid in 10 installments.
 - (c) Students are not allowed to discontinue the bus service once fee book is issued.
 - (d) School Bus is not available for quarterly, half-yearly or in months.
 - (e) Being fully aware of conditions a, b, c & d decide whether to use or not to use school bus.
2. Payments are to be made by A/c payee **CHEQUES / DD & CASH only, CHEQUES/DD** should be issued in favour of "**CAMPION BUS SERVICE BHOWRI**"

3. All the fee should be paid by **15TH OF JANUARY, 2024**. After **15TH JANUARY, 2024 ONLY DD** will be accepted.
4. No Bus user shall be allowed to use BUS SERVICE without BUS PASS.
5. BUS PASS will be issued for every Two months only on advance payment.
6. Bus fee is to be paid before 15th of every month thereafter **Late Fee 100/-** will be charged.
7. Out station and postdated cheques are not accepted.
8. In case of cheque bounces a fine of **Rs. 500/-** will be charged for insufficient fund and **Rs. 200/-** will be charged for any other reasons related to cheque.
9. If two or more students are from the same family individual cheques are to be issued for each student.
10. Bus pass must be carried whenever the school bus is used and shown on demand to the bus conductor/monitor. This pass shall not be detached from the school dairy.
11. Unauthorised traveller, even for a day, will have to pay for the full month.
12. **Indiscipline behaviour in school bus or with the bus personnel either by student or parent will make the pupil ineligible to use school transportation.**
13. Damage to any bus property shall be made good by the concerned student.
14. The school will not be held responsible for providing alternative transport facilities in case of a break down or road block.
15. All must reach their bus stops at least 5 minutes before the arrival of the bus.
16. Buses will stop only at the predetermined stops. Let students select the most suitable stops.
17. Bus fees will be revised whenever cost of petroleum product is increased.
